Issuing instructions

To be conducted between 15 September 2025 and 15 May 2026.

All completed work must be submitted to AQA by 15 May 2026.

Materials

For this paper you must have:

• appropriate facilities and materials for producing and recording compositions.

Instructions

- Composition 1: Composition to a brief: Choose **one** of the briefs in this booklet.
- Composition 2: Free composition: This need not reference areas of study or a given brief.
- For each composition you must include a programme note (approx.150 words).
- For each composition you must include a notated score and/or lead sheet and/or aural guide.
- For each composition you must include an audio file, preferably in .mp3 format, although .wav and other audio formats that would play on any device are also acceptable.
- Together, the compositions **must** last a combined minimum time of **four and a half minutes**. There is no maximum duration.
- If the combined minimum duration of your composition is **less than four and a half minutes** then a penalty proportionate to the severity of the timing infringement will be applied.
- You must have sufficient direct supervision to ensure that the work submitted can be confidently authenticated as your own.

- The maximum mark for this paper is 50.

0 1 Brief 1: Chorales

Candidates should complete **both** chorales.

Chorale 1

Complete the harmonisation of the following chorale by adding parts for alto and tenor.



Chorale 2

Harmonise the following chorale melody by adding parts for alto, tenor and bass.

0 2 Brief 2

Compose a song in a lively **soul** style.

The song will be released on a music streaming platform.

The song must include the following motifs.



The motifs may be:

- · used in any order
- used separately or simultaneously
- used in any section(s) of the song
- · transposed to any pitch
- developed and extended.

The song must be scored for:

- solo and backing vocals
- drum kit
- · electric guitar
- bass guitar.

You may include other instruments of your choice.

You should provide lyrics. These may be your own or someone else's (who should be acknowledged).

You will **not** be assessed on the quality of the lyrics.


0 3 Brief 3

Compose music to underscore a scene in a romantic comedy movie.

The scene takes place in the evening in a café, where the two main characters are having dinner. There is a small band playing in the background. In the scene your music will be diegetic: it will look and sound as though it is being played live by this band.

The Director would like your music to reflect a change of mood in the scene.

Your music should include the following two leitmotifs. Each leitmotif is associated with one of the two main characters.



The music must be scored for live performance by instruments which would be appropriate for the context of performance in a café.

The music should last between **two** and **three** minutes.

Write a song for a musical which is inspired by the life of Marie Curie.

The song is a **solo** for the main character, Marie Curie. The song occurs midway through the first act of the musical. She is singing about her determination to overcome the frustrations in her scientific work.

Your song must use the following lyrics.

I've worked through days that stretch to endless night,
The measurements seem just out of reach,
The spark I seek stays stubborn, hides from sight,
The clues fall silent; they do not teach.
I sift the pitchblende till my fingers bleed,
The air is thick with dust and doubt,
And still, I dig—this endless, desperate need,
But where's the answer? When will it shout?

They call me stubborn; let them call me more,
I will not shrink beneath their gaze,
I'll crush each doubt that's thrown before my door,
I'll set this world, this element, ablaze.
For there's something glowing deep within,
Not just the radium's dim light,
It's the promise that my mind could win,
Though shadows press and fuse with night.

I'll dig through earth, I'll burn through flame,
Till truth lies shimmering in my hand,
And though they may not know my name,
They will come to understand.
The sparks will sing, and I'll name them all,
The hidden rays, the phantom's gleam,
I'll prove that even those who stumble, fall,
Can rise again, can chase the dream.

You may add further lyrics. You will **not** be assessed on the quality of the lyrics.

The song must include the following accompaniment. It may be transposed if you wish.



The song must be scored for at least two and up to eight instruments of your choice.

0 5 Brief 5

Compose a piece in **Bebop** style.

The piece will be performed at an event celebrating the centenary of John Coltrane's birth.

The piece should be composed in the structure of a Head arrangement.

The piece must use the following changes (chord progression) for the Head.

B♭maj7	Gm7	D7	Gm7	C7	Fmaj7	B♭maj7	D7
Gm7	D7	E₅maj7	G7	Cm7	Fmaj7	B♭maj7	F7

Developments of the changes (chord progression) from the Head may use:

- chord substitution
- chord extension
- chord alteration.

The piece must be fully notated.

The piece must be scored for:

- either solo piano
- **or** a solo instrument of your choice with accompanying instrument(s). The accompaniment must include **either** a piano **or** a guitar.

0 6 Brief 6

Compose a piece of instrumental music which is a fusion of Latin American and Western European styles.

The piece will be performed as the introductory music for the opening of a dance competition.

The competition organisers would like the music to capture the spirit of the event's strapline:

Each step is a symphony of movement, unleashing the rhythm of the soul.

You must choose at least one Latin American dance rhythm and use it in your piece.

The piece must contain the following features:

- · chromatic melody
- rhythmic energy
- syncopation.

The piece must be scored for an ensemble of **up to four** pitched instruments of your choice.

Additional untuned percussion instruments may also be used.

0 7 Brief 7

Compose a piece of postmodernist instrumental music.

The piece will be performed at a festival promoting the music of current Celtic composers.

The piece must be based on the following Celtic folk melody.







The folk melody may be stated in its entirety **and/or** used as fragments of motif and phrase.

The piece must contain the following features:

- contrapuntal textures
- dissonant and non-functional harmonies.

The piece must be scored for:

- either an ensemble of a minimum of four and a maximum of eight acoustic instruments
- or a string orchestra.
